Psychology graduates are equipped with both technical and soft skills that different industries are looking for. The recent survey findings showed that a majority of Psychology graduates were employed in Educational Institutions, while others were employed in the Commerce & Industry, Community, Social & Personal Services, and Civil Services.

In addition, psychology graduates have the option to proceed to further studies in professional programmes at the postgraduate level, such as Clinical Psychology, Educational Psychology, and Counselling. Some graduates would pursue advanced research training in all related research areas of Psychology, including Cognitive Science and Neuroscience.
