## Master of Science (MSc) in the field of Applied Geosciences

- 1. Applications are invited for admission in September 2024 to read for the degree of Master of Science (MSc). To be eligible for admission to the programme, a candidate shall satisfy both the University Admission Requirements and the Programme Specific Requirements as listed below:
  - (a) shall comply with the General Regulations;
  - (b) shall hold a Bachelor's degree with honours of this University or a qualification of equivalent standard from this University or another comparable institution accepted for this purpose;
  - (c) shall satisfy the examiners in a qualifying examination if required; and
  - (d) for a candidate who is seeking admission on the basis of a qualification from a university or comparable institution outside Hong Kong of which the language of teaching and/or examination is not English, shall satisfy the University English language requirement applicable to high degrees as prescribed under General Regulation G2(b).

Applicants should possess a Bachelor's degree with First or Second Class Honours (or GPA equivalent) in Science, Engineering or a related subject.

- 2. The MSc in Applied Geosciences was introduced in 1998-99. It is an inter-disciplinary programme extending over two years of part-time study or one year of full-time study.
- 3. The programme is intended to provide students with further training in the applied geosciences for career and personal development.
- 4. Students work in small classes and are expected to participate in class discussion. For part-time students in full-time employment, the programme involves a considerable commitment of time, as part-time students usually have to attend classes on 2-3 weekday evenings (7:00-9:45pm), and occasionally field trips on weekends. Written work forms an important part of the programme, and includes a project dissertation of approximately 10,000 words. (All written and oral communication is in English).

- 7. The results of the admissions exercise are expected to be announced as soon as possible but not later than August 2024. - 8. Application period (Local and Non-local students):

Applications are processed continuously. Early application is advantageous.

Round 2: 12:00 noon (GMT +8), April 30, 2024

Applicants who require a student visa should submit their applications before March 31, 2024, as it takes about 3 months to process the entry visa and late applicants may not meet the commencement date.
