Eligibility

To be eligible for admission to the programme, a candidate shall satisfy both the University Admissions Requirements including but not limited to:

- (a) shall comply with the General Regulations;
- (b) shall hold a Bachelor's degree in Engineering or Science discipline of this University or a qualification of equivalent standard from this University or another comparable institution accepted for this purpose;
- (c) for a candidate who is seeking admission on the basis of a qualification from a university or comparable institution outside Hong Kong of which the language of teaching and/or examination is not English, shall satisfy the University English language requirement applicable to high degrees as prescribed under General Regulation G2(b).
- (d) satisfy the examiners in a qualifying examination if required.

An application for exemption from the above requirements shall be considered on a case by case basis.

English Language Requirement

Applicants who hold a degree from a university or comparable institution outside Hong Kong where the language of teaching and /or examination was not English must satisfy the <u>University English language requirement</u>* for admission, unless they are granted an exceptional exemption.

*Please note that the University's TOEFL code is 9671.

Application Fee

The application fee is HK\$300 per application. It is non-refundable and must be paid online.

Announcement of Results

Applicants who do not hear from the University by July 31, 2025 may assume their applications unsuccessful.

Composition Fee

The proposed composition fee for 2025/26 intake is HK\$270,000 (local students) and HK\$360,000 (non-local students), subject to the University's approval.

The composition fee is payable annually in four identical instalments for part-time students (within the two-year normative study period). Students will be continuing to charge the composition fee on semester / yearly basis if they exceed the normative study period.

Admission Deposit

Upon acceptance of the offer of admission, applicants are required to pay a deposit consisting of the first instalment of the composition fee, the caution money (HK\$350), and the student activity fee (HK\$100, applicable to full-time students only). The first instalment will be applied toward the total composition fee. Fees once paid are not refundable.

Definition of Non-local students

For the purpose of admission of non-local students, "non-local

students" should be defined as students holding

- a) student visa/ entry permit;
- b) visa/entry permit under the Immigration Arrangements for Non-local Graduates; or
- c) dependant visa/ entry permit who were 18 years old or above when they were issued with such visa/ entry permit by the Director of Immigration; or
- d) visa / entry permit for Top Talent Pass Scheme.
