**SUPPORTING DOCUMENTS**

1. After submitting an online application via the University's online application system (<https://admissions.hku.hk/tpg/programme-list>), within one day, applicants will receive an email from the Faculty with login ID and password to access the Faculty's MScUDT Application Documents Submission System (<https://admission.arch.hku.hk/login>). Please upload the below list of supporting documents to the MScUDT Application Documents Submission System **by 12:00 noon (GMT+8), on 2 January 2025.** Please do not encrypt the supporting documents.
  - a) HKID copy for local applicants or passport copy for non-local applicants
  - b) Resume
  - c) Personal Statement
  - d) Official transcripts
  - e) Graduation certificate (if any)
  - f) Test Report of the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL), or International English Language Testing System (IELTS) (if you have not been studying in the university in which the courses are taught in English).
  - g) Applicants whose undergraduate degree is design related such as Urban Planning, Landscape, Urban Design or Architecture or related discipline have to submit an electronic copy of a design portfolio demonstrating your work in design related project, or design related professional work. There are no limits on layout. The portfolio should not exceed 40 pages (95 Mb). The date, the nature of the project (i.e., academic, personal, or professional), and collaboration information must be indicated on the content page. If the project is collaborative work, the applicant's role must be indicated clearly to avoid plagiarism.
  - h) Applicant whose undergraduate degree is in transport or is not specifically related to design are encouraged (optional) to submit an electronic portfolio of projects (transport related, personal, etc.). There are no limits on layout. The portfolio should not exceed 40 pages (95 Mb). The date, the nature of the project (i.e., academic, personal, or professional), and collaboration information must be indicated on the content page. If the project is collaborative work, the applicant's role must be indicated clearly to avoid plagiarism.

Applicants will only be requested to submit hard copies of supporting documents when they receive an admission offer. Therefore, please do not submit hard copies to the Faculty Office before you receive the offer. If you have submitted an electronic portfolio, hard copy are not required.

2. Applicants have to appoint 2 referees via the University's online application system (<https://admissions.hku.hk/tpg/programme-list>).

Both of your referees will be requested to complete an online referee report and upload a reference letter via a separate email sent by the Faculty.

**\*\* It is crucial that the applicants must input accurate information on their online application form.**

**Any inaccurate information may cause email delivery failures and unavailable access to online submission systems. All application materials should be submitted by 12:00 noon (GMT+8), 2 January 2025.**

The University of Hong Kong has not entered into any agreement or collaboration with any intermediary agencies for overseas studies in respect of a mechanism of “quota for direct admission”. Applicants are strongly advised not to engage any agency to submit an application or any application materials on their behalf. Applicants should prepare and submit their applications and supporting documents directly to HKU.”
