Master of Science in Conservation

(One-year Full time & Two-year Part-time)

- 1. Applications are invited for admission in September 2022 to the Master of Science in Conservation Programme.
- 2. To be eligible for admission to the programme, a candidate shall satisfy both the University Admissions Requirements and Programme Specific Requirements.
 - a) shall comply with the <u>General Regulations</u> and the Regulations for Taught Postgraduate Curricula;
 - b) hold a Bachelor's degree in a relevant field of this University or from a comparable institution accepted for this purpose; motivated candidates with a degree in other disciplines with relevant experience may also apply, subject to approval by the Faculty on a case-by-case basis;
 - c) for a candidate who is seeking admission on the basis of a qualification from a university or comparable institution outside Hong Kong of which the language of teaching and/or examination is not English, shall satisfy the University English language requirement applicable to high degrees as prescribed under General Regulation G2(b).
 - d) satisfy the examiners in a qualifying examination if required.
- 3. The Programme is designed primarily for students with a background in a built environment-related discipline, including but not limited to architecture, landscape architecture, urban studies, urban planning, urban design, surveying, engineering, archaelogy, etc. Motivated candidates with a degree from other disciplines with relevant experience may also apply, subject to approval by the Faculty on a case-by-case basis.
- 4. The Programme is designed to equip students with the technical competencies and intellectual skills required to guide decision-making in conservation planning, management and design in the 21st century. Through a combination of dedicated seminars, studios and elective courses, students will gain theoretical and practical insights into the latest policies, methodologies and best practices and apply their knowledge to real-life projects. To qualify for the MSc(Cons) degree, all candidates are required to complete a total of 72 credits of courses with a combination of core courses, stream courses, and electives.
- 5. The Programme offers two streams of specialization, with each focusing on an expertise of the conservation profession:
 - i) Conservation Planning and Management; and
 - ii) Design for Conservation.

Applicants to the programme must choose one of the two streams as their specialization in their application.

6. Applicants selecting "Design for Conservation" stream must submit a portfolio that demonstrates their design skills and experience. Proper credit and context must be given for all work related to author, collaborators, and professional office in which the work was

completed or academic course and instructor for which the work was completed, where appropriate. The portfolio should be in PDF format and should not exceed 15 pages nor 30Mb.

- 7. There is an international field trip to an outstanding heritage site in the region every year as part of the Programme curriculum and students are expected to cover the expenses of the trip.
- 8. The programme is not accredited by the Hong Kong Institute of Architectural Conservationists (HKICON). The University will seek accreditation from HKICON and the Royal Institute of Chartered Surveyors (RICS) for the degree upon completion of studies of the graduating class in 2023.
- 9. The programme fee is HK\$204,600 (Subject to final approval by the University) and will be paid in 4 installments (HK\$51,150) for the part-time programme on semester basis according to the University schedule. For the full-time programme, the fees will be paid by two installments (HK\$102,300 per installment).
- 10. Applications should be submitted via our on-line application system at https://admissions.hku.hk/tpg/programme-list-2223. After submission of an online application, candidates are required to upload the supporting documents directly to the Faculty's MSc(Conservation) Application Documents Submission System. Please refer to the "Supporting Documents" for details.
- 11. The closing date for application is extended at 12:00 noon (GMT+8), March 31, 2022 (Thursday). Successful applicants will be notified by the end of June 2022.

Frequently Asked Questions

The following are some frequently asked questions raised by potential applicants:

- 1. What are the basic requirements for admission?
 - Comply with the <u>General Regulations</u> and the Regulations for Taught Postgraduate Curricula
 - Hold a bachelor degree in a built environment related-discipline, such as architecture, landscape architecture, urban studies, urban planning, urban design, surveying and engineering. Motivated candidates with a degree from other disciplines with relevant experience may also apply, subject to approval by the Faculty on a case-by-case basis.
 - If your qualification is from a university or comparable institution outside Hong Kong of which the language of teaching and/or examination is not English, you shall satisfy the University English language requirement applicable to high degrees as prescribed under General Regulation G2(b).
- 2. Is an interview required for admission to the Programme?
 - Shortlisted candidates will be invited for an admission interviews. Details of interview arrangement will be sent to the shortlisted candidates via email.
- 3. Who can be nominated as referees?
 - The referee should be the applicant's professor or colleague who is in a senior position that can comment on the applicant's abilities. This senior person does not need to be in the field of heritage.
- 4. Will my application be rejected if the supporting documents cannot be submitted before the application deadline?
 - The submission systems will be closed after the application deadline. Applicants are advised to submit all the supporting documents on time according to the instructions provided. Otherwise, the chance for admission will be slim due to incomplete supporting document
- 5. Is practical work experience essential for my application?
 - Practical work experience is not an essential requirement for admission but preference will be given to those applicants with relevant experience that may have contributed to enhancing their potential in the field of heritage conservation.
- 6. *Is there a minimum GPA requirement?*
 - There is no absolute GPA requirement set for the admission to the Programme but applicants with good academic results will be considered favourably.
- 7. How can I fulfil the University's English Language Proficiency requirement if the medium of instruction in my University is not English?
 - An applicant is required to obtain either a score of 550 or above (paper-based test) or 80 or above (internet-based test) in the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL; University TOEFL code: 9671) (non-home edition); or a minimum

- overall band of 6 with no subtest lower than 5.5 in the International English Language Testing System (IELTS).
- Test scores obtained more than 2 years will not be accepted. Your test report will be considered valid if it is non-expired on the date of your application.
- 8. What is the fee structure of the programme?
 - The programme fee is HK\$204,600 (Subject to final approval by the University) and will be paid in 4 installments (HK\$51,150) for the part-time programme on semester basis according to the University schedule. For the full-time programme, the fees will be paid by two installments (HK\$102,300 per installment).
